Guidelines to the use of contents in Cabinets A & B

- Gloves are provided in the cabinet; due to the fragile nature and condition of archives, items in archival boxes must be handled with gloves.
- Patrons must request an item from a staff member; staff members must monitor the use of the item and hold the patron's driver's license. The patron driver's license is required as a "hold".
- No items, from either of the locked cabinets, may be handled away from staff monitoring. The items are locked in cabinets because they are irreplaceable.
- Staff will have to consistently monitor patrons' handling of archival and other materials. Please peruse items at the front desk (with gloves if item is archival).
- Xerox copies are permitted with staff supervision.
